The Center offers exceptional opportunities to conduct cutting-edge research in implementation science, collaborations with multidisciplinary faculty, and close partnerships with community-based agencies. A key strength of the Center is its active engagement with traditionally underserved populations designed to address diverse health disparities. The Center is part of a vibrant and growing Department of Medicine in the UIC College of Medicine with well-established research programs in prevention and intervention for a wide range of diseases. Faculty collaborate across schools of public health, engineering, applied health, dentistry, pharmacy, education, social work, and nursing.

The successful candidate will demonstrate a record of extramural funding, strong publications, collaborative research, mentoring, and experience in implementation science. Candidates who seek to advance the Center's commitment to diversity and inclusion in teaching, mentorship, service and research are encouraged to apply. Applicants whose research in implementation science aligns with one or more of the nine divisions within the Department of Medicine are of particular interest: Academic Internal Medicine and Geriatrics; Nephrology; Gastroenterology and Hepatology; Hematology and Oncology; Infectious Diseases; Cardiology; Endocrinology, Diabetes, and Metabolism; Pulmonary, Critical Care, Sleep and Allergy; Rheumatology. National and international recognition is expected for more senior-level applicants.
