We are conducting a study funded by the National Institutes of Health to explore the influence of actual and perceived immigration laws on Latinx immigrant participants' willingness to seek and utilize important community health services. The name of the study is Proyecto Luz 2.0. During this current phase of the study, **we are inviting adult men and women (18 years or older), Spanish-speaking Latinx o/a, non-citizens (documented and undocumented) from Chicago to participate in a one-time anonymous online Spanish survey.** The survey is followed by a brief video to give participants important information and resources on immigration-related laws and health concerns. It will take about 90 minutes to 2 hours for the survey and presentation. **Participants will receive a \$50 Target gift card** after they have completed the survey. The survey examines the influence of actual and perceived immigration laws on US Latino immigrants' willingness to seek and utilize important community health services. This survey may help shape equitable and sound immigration-related law and policies.
