Centers for AIDS Research Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Pipeline Initiative (CDEIPI)

Summary for National CFAR Meeting, Chicago, November 2022

Goals

1. To promote the inclusion and advancement of early-stage scholars from racial and ethnic groups underrepresented in HIV science and medicine
2. To conduct ongoing program evaluation to inform future directions
3. To develop a national community of CFAR academicians to work collaboratively on the CDEIPI initiative

Timeline

- Aug 2021: Initial CDEIPI supplement to DC CFAR as CDEIPI Coordinating Center (CC)
- Sept-Nov 2021: CDEIPI RFP sent to CFARs, proposals submitted by 15 CFARs and presented to NIH and other CFARs, revised proposals submitted to NIH for review
- Dec 2021: Sub awards established with 15 CFARs, CDEIPI activities initiated
- May 2022: NIH issued call for second round of CDEIPI supplements
- Summer 2022: NIH directly funded 14 initial CFARs, 2 additional CFARs, and DC CFAR CC

Key CDEIPI Features

- Focus on high school, undergraduate, graduate, and post-doctoral scholars
- Programs at two or more educational levels to develop pathways and peer-to-peer mentoring
- Partnerships with Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) and other Minority Serving Institutions (MSIs)
- Monthly meetings of CFAR Program leads, CFAR Evaluation leads, and with the NIH CFAR Program Office; monthly CDEIPI Newsletter

Progress through Summer 2022

- CDEIPI programs launched at the high school (7), post-baccalaureate (2), undergraduate (11), graduate (12) and post-doctoral (3) levels
- Focus on Black/African American, Hispanic/Latino and Indigenous students with one CFAR focused on students from underrepresented racial/ethnic and sexual/gender minorities
- Seminars, intensive multi-day workshops, summer residential programs and mentored research internship opportunities in laboratory, field work and public health department settings
- More than 100 participating scholars at the high school (31), undergraduate (64), graduate (26) and postdoctoral (1) levels at the 12 CFARs reporting individual level data in the first 6 months
- 17 CFARs and >20 HBCUs/MSIs participating in programs from Hawaii to the Pacific Northwest, California, the Midwest, Texas, Florida, Puerto Rico, the South and the Northeast
- Evaluation plan includes a quarterly survey of all CDEIPI sites and customized individual-level surveys for CFAR Scholars, and CFAR-specific evaluations
- CDEIPI Overview Manuscript under review at JAIDS, CDEIPI Journal Supplement proposal with 19 articles accepted by JAIDS with projected publication date in summer 2023
